SUCCESSFUL EYE CAMPS



Rashida Bi is 75 years old. The trust members met her recently during a survey in her village. Rashida has zero vision in her right eye and can barely see with her left one due to cataract. Rashida lives alone and has no source of income. She has no medical or economic help. The Trust is trying to organize support for her.

Recent eye camp benefited 31 people from different villages and religions. People of different age group were benefited through this camp. It not only included people of age exceeding 50years, for cataract operation but also benefited several small children with impaired vision.

Eight year old Beena (far left) from Jhullas, which is 3 kilometers from the Line Of Control and navneet Kaur (far right) from Poonch had their vision corrected with the help of Pritam Spiritual Foundation. The happiness on their faces later was a sight for sore eyes. Four year old Kossar Bi (center) from village Dagwar, also near Line Of Control, had a lip deformity since birth. Her father Mohammad Shafi is a poor farmer earning barely Rs. 2000 per month. The Trust came to their rescue and organized medical treatment for the young girl.








STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS
